

Scottish Paediatric Renal Urology Network

Research & Latest News Teaching Session Evaluation Report

March 2022

The Scottish Paediatric Renal Urology Network (SPRUN) hosted a Research & Latest News Teaching session on Thursday 31st March 2022. Results from the evaluation are as follows.

There were 18 delegates in attendance. Evaluations were received from 11 attendees giving a response rate of 61%.

Figure 1 - Designations

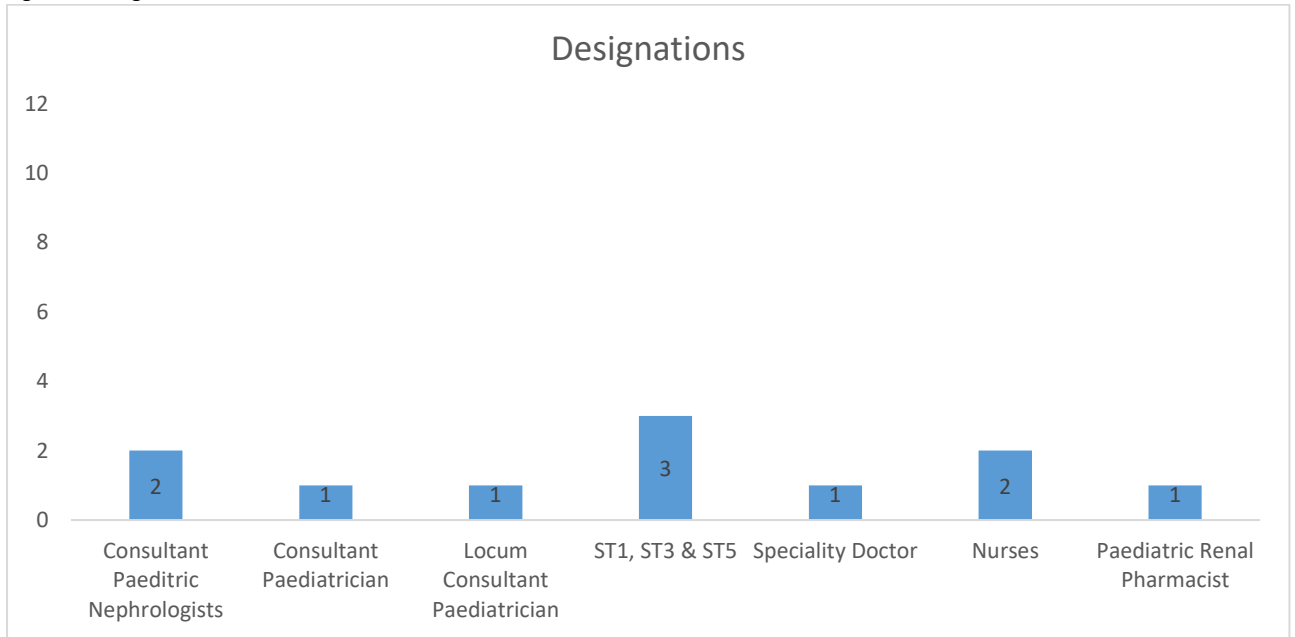
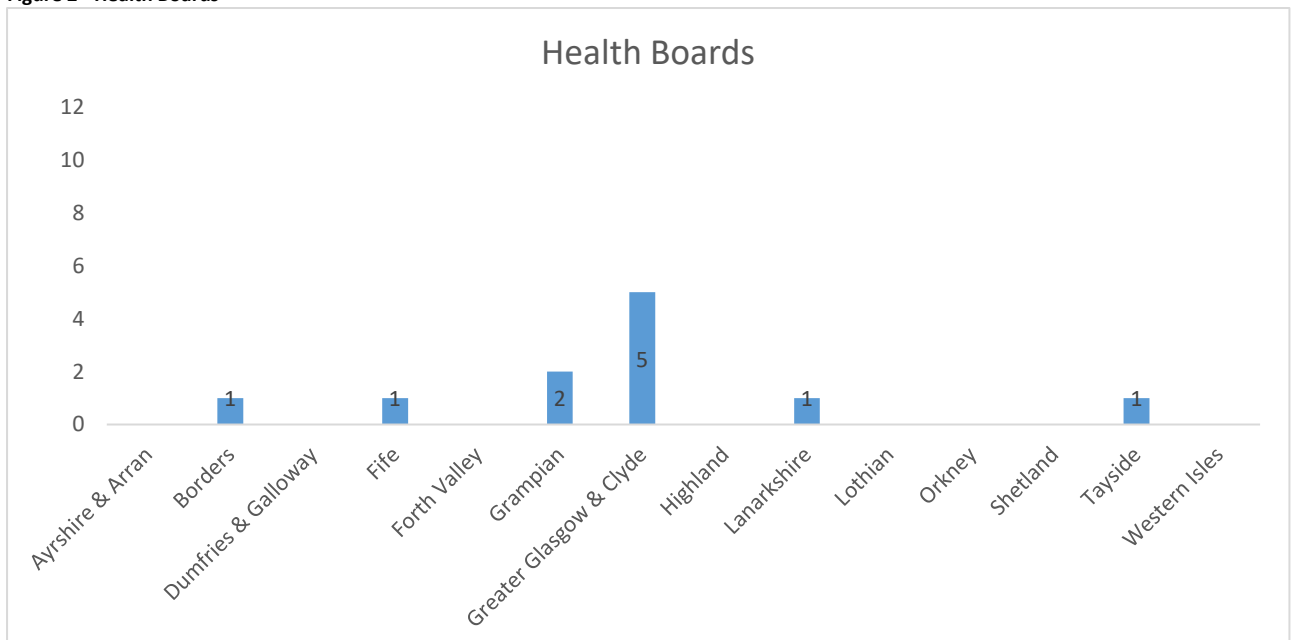


Figure 2 - Health Boards



The objective of this event was to provide up to date education/information for professionals around research and latest news in relation to renal/urology related conditions. Attendees were asked if this objective had been met and to also rate the presentations.

Figure 3 - Objective Met: Providing Up to Date Education/Information

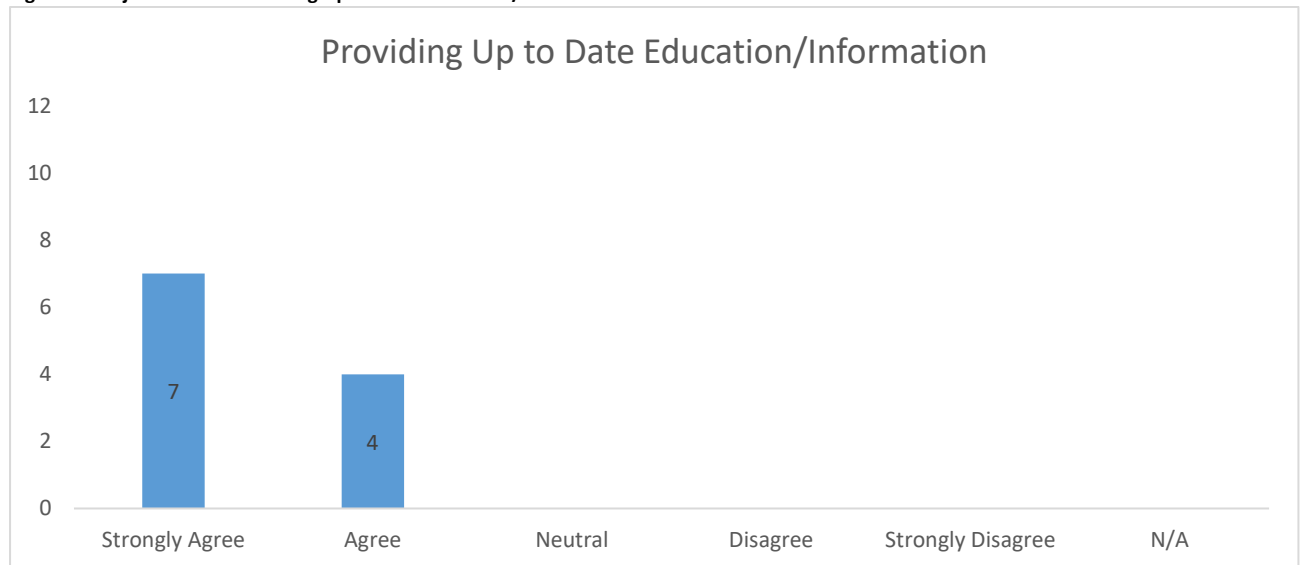
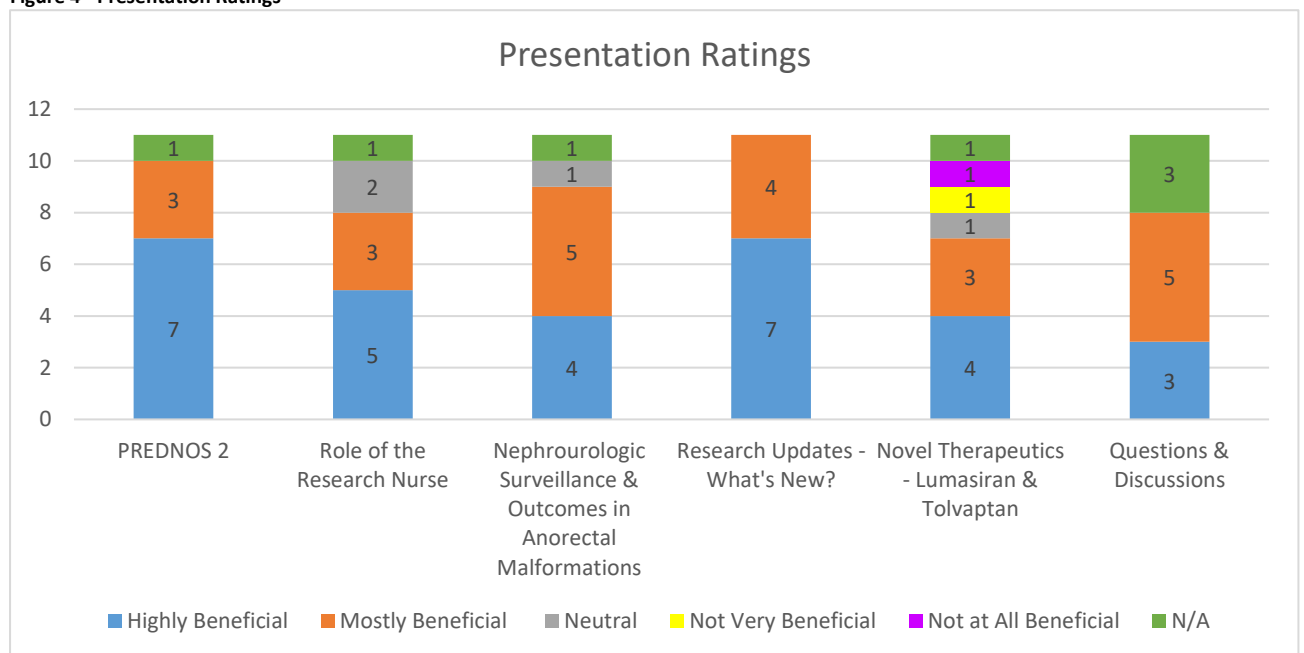


Figure 4 - Presentation Ratings



Additional Benefits

Participants were asked what they had gained as a result of attending this event. The general consensus was that the event had provided a lot of useful information, improved knowledge/understanding in relation to clinical trials, research and new medications.

A few quotes are noted below:

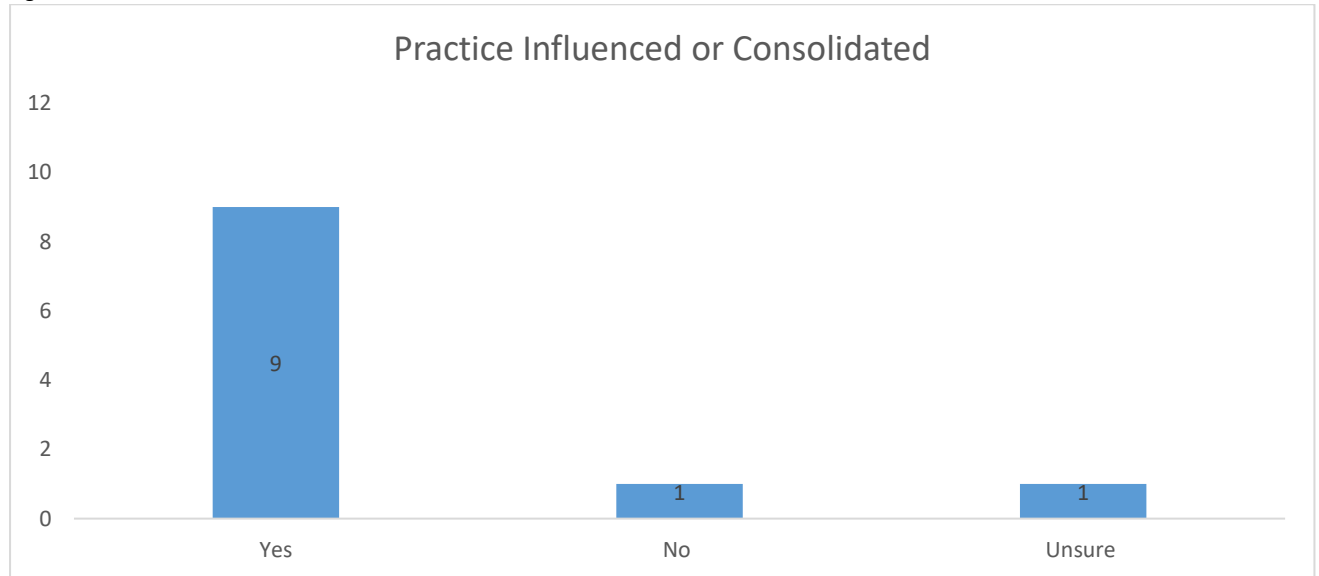
- ***“Awareness of recently completed and ongoing studies related to kidney disease in the UK.”***
- ***“Renewed excitement about research.”***

- ***“A better understanding of current research aims - both nationally as well as what the team in Scotland are focussing on.”***
- ***“Enjoyed learning about the PREDNOS study for nephrotic syndrome with URTI getting Prednisolone as was not aware of this study.”***

Practice Influenced or Consolidated

Participants were asked if their practice had been influenced or consolidated by attending the event. The vast majority (82%) of respondents indicated that their practice was either influenced or consolidated as a result of attending this event as indicated in Figure 5 - Practice Influenced or Consolidated.

Participants were asked how their practice would change as a result of attending this event and points are noted as below:

- ***“Better understanding of Tolvaptan and indications for its use.”***
- ***“PREDNOS 2 outcomes.”***
- ***“PREDNOS 2 study, clarification on consensus opinion of using steroid cover during an URTI and how to explain this to colleagues.”***
- ***“Learn more about future trials.”***
- ***“Better understanding of the rationale behind Prednisolone use for SSNS.”***

Future topics

Cystic Kidney Diseases was suggested as a future topic.

Additional Comments

It was noted that the “Pharmacology talk was too advanced for current knowledge”.

Summary & Conclusion

There were 18 delegates who attended. 11 responses were received to the evaluation giving a response rate of 61%. All respondents (100%) indicated that the overall objective of providing up to date education/information had been met. Between 64% - 100% of respondents found each of the presentations (including questions & discussions) either highly or mostly beneficial. The remaining responses either remained neutral, were not applicable, not very beneficial or not at all beneficial. Complexity was suspected to be the

reason for a few attendees finding the Novel Therapeutics - Lumasiran & Tolvaptan presentation not as beneficial.

Increased knowledge/understanding of research and medication use were the main themes around changes to practice.

Overall, the event was a great success. SPRUN will review all feedback, explore how it can be utilised to shape and further improve future events.

Recommendations

- To consider simplifying educational content.
- To consider suggested topics for future events.
