

Scottish Paediatric Renal Urology Network

Miscellaneous Topics Teaching Session Evaluation Report

January 2023

The Scottish Paediatric Renal Urology Network (SPRUN) hosted a Miscellaneous Topics Teaching Session on Tuesday 31st January 2023. Results from the evaluation are as follows.

There were 20 delegates in attendance. Evaluations were received from 13 attendees giving a response rate of 65%.

Figure 1 - Designations

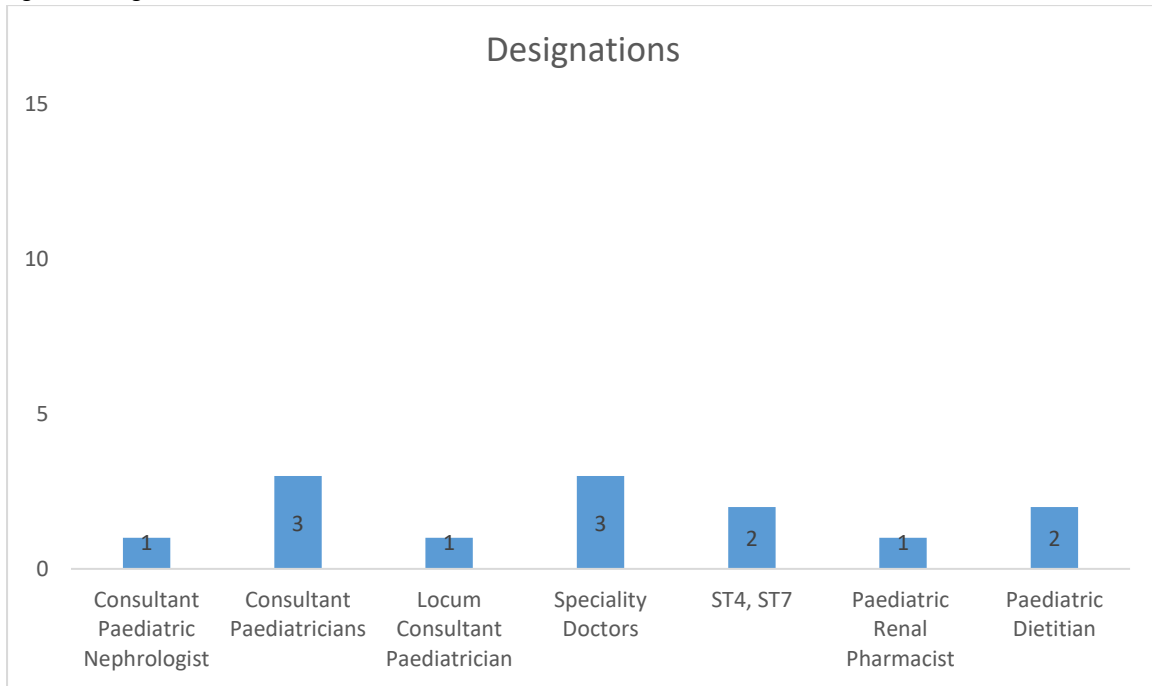
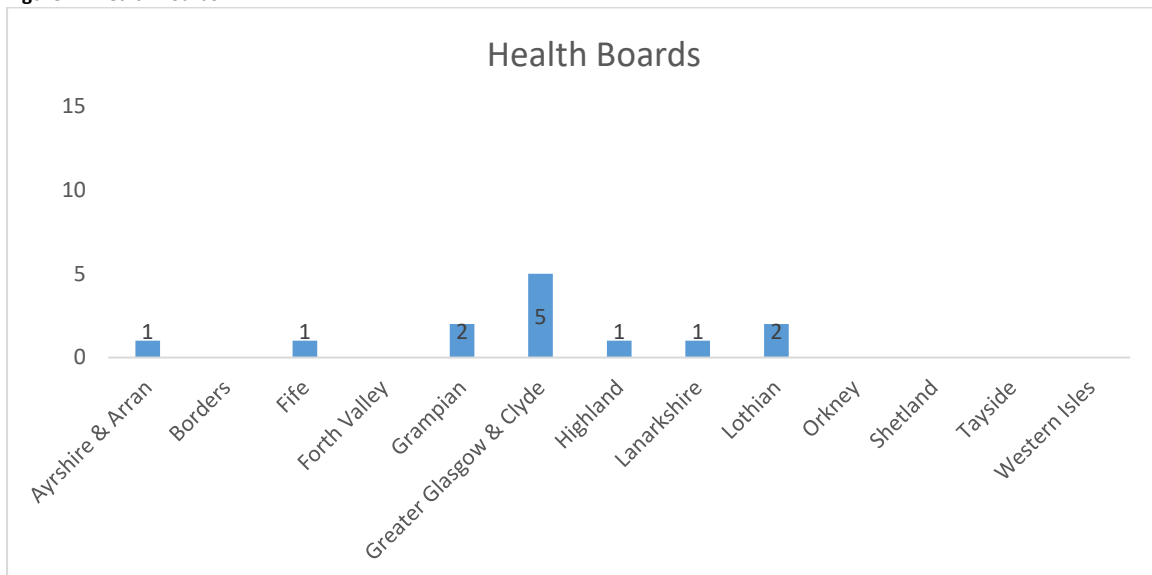


Figure 2 - Health Boards



The aim of this event was to provide up to date education/information for professionals who care for children with renal and/or urology related healthcare needs. Attendees were asked if this objective had been met and to also rate the presentations.

Figure 3 - Objective Met: Providing Up to Date Education/Information

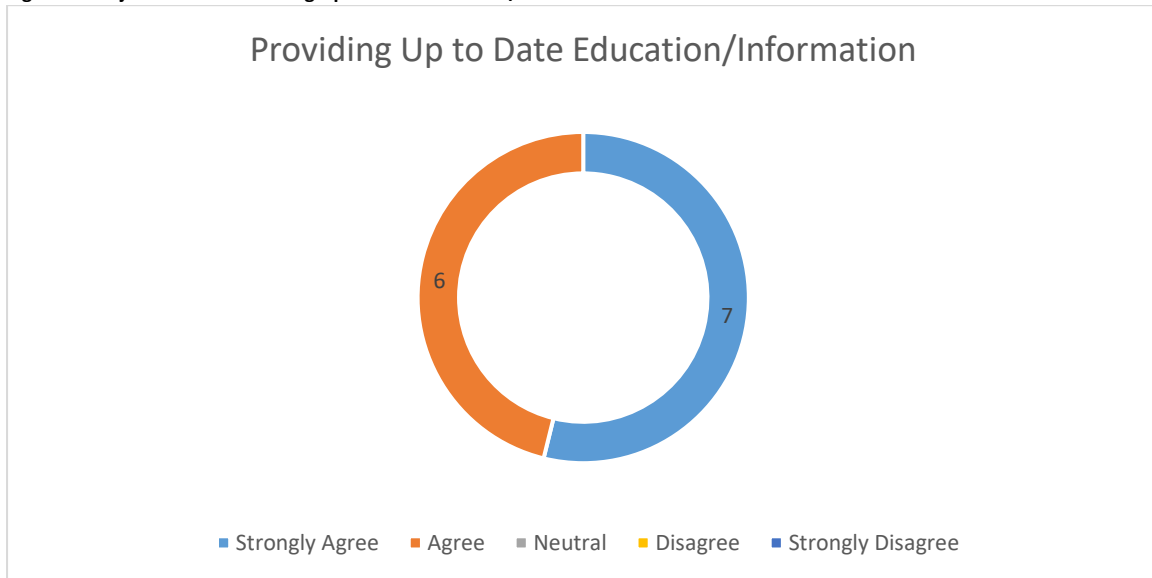
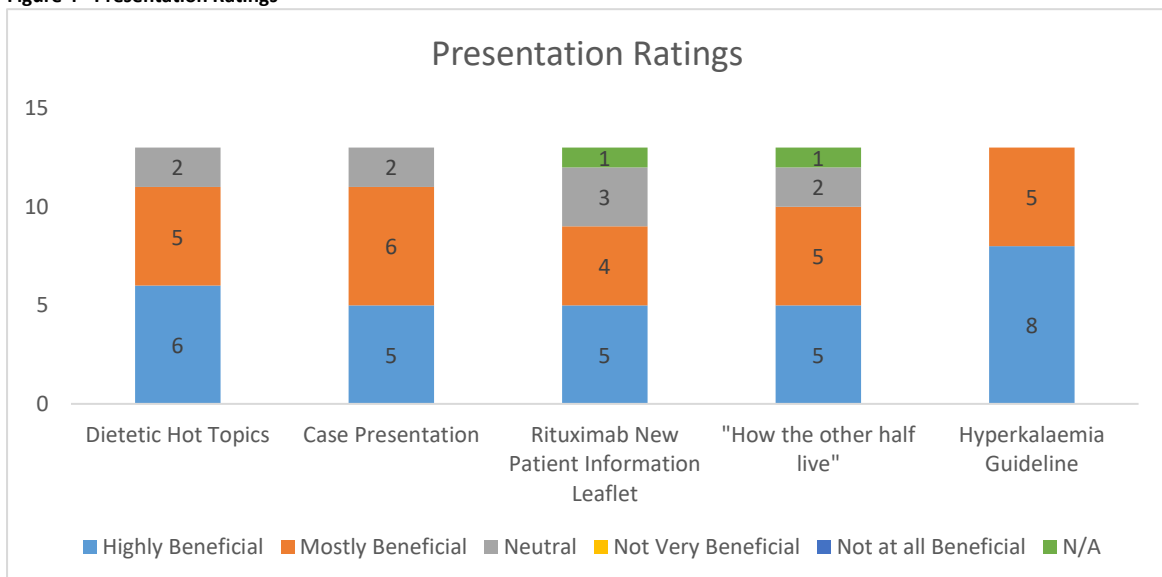


Figure 4 - Presentation Ratings



Additional Benefits

Participants were asked what they had gained as a result of attending this event. The consensus was that the event had provided a lot of useful information which had improved awareness and understanding/reflection on areas such as diet, hyperkalaemia management/guideline and care provided by the NHS.

A few quotes are noted below:

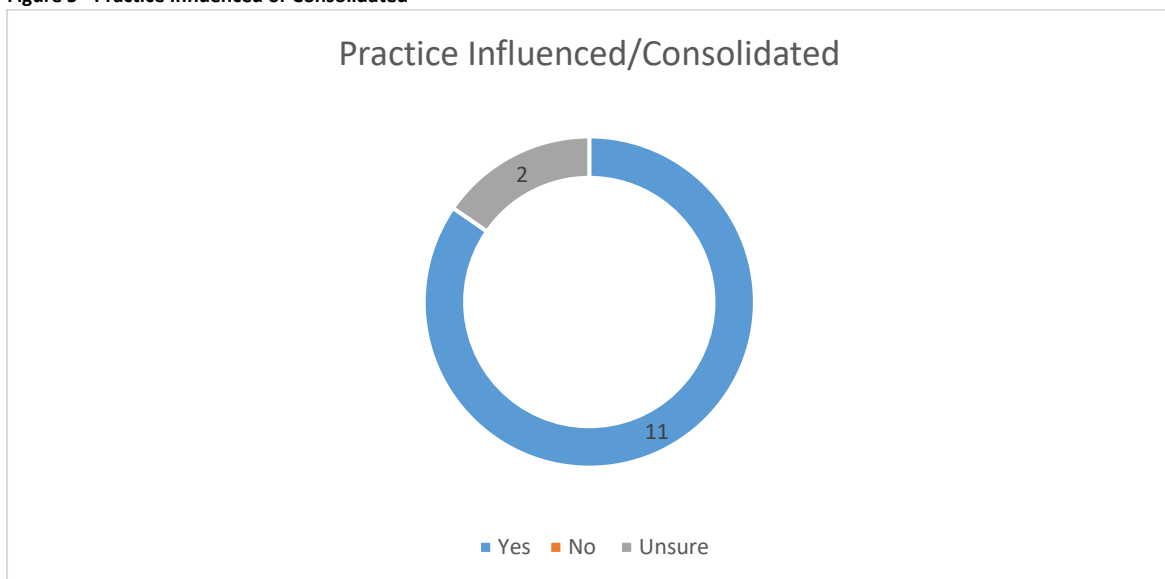
- *“Understanding of more areas. Reflection on how the other half live.”*
- *“Great thoughts about plant based diets especially. Incredibly interesting to hear about experiences in Africa, although....slightly less immediate impact on current practice.”*
- *“New dietary awareness. Don't take the NHS for granted. Excellent guideline for hyperkalaemia - very simple to use.”*

- *“Think about the positive impact of even a small change to the diet for children with CKD.”*
- *“Very good mix of presentations today. Lots of useful practical advice.”*

Practice Influenced or Consolidated

Participants were asked if their practice had been influenced or consolidated by attending the event. 85% of respondents indicated that their practice was either influenced or consolidated as a result of attending this event as indicated in Figure 5 - Practice Influenced or Consolidated.

Participants were asked how their practice would change as a result of attending this event. Some points are as noted as below:

- *“Structured hyperkalaemia approach. More aware of dietary benefits in CKD.”*
- *“Look at the different pathway to managing hyperkalaemia.”*
- *“Better understanding of rituximab and thinking earlier about calcium carbonate for hyperkalaemia.”*
- *“Will have more confidence and clarity in sharing information with patients.”*

Additional Comments

- *“Thank you, another great teaching session.”*
- *“It was great, well done to all the presenters..”*

Summary & Conclusion

There were 20 delegates who attended. 13 responses were received to the evaluation giving a response rate of 65%. All respondents indicated that the overall objective of providing up to date education/information had been met. Between 69% - 100% of respondents also found each of the presentations (including case presentations) either highly or mostly beneficial. Between 15% - 23% of respondents remained neutral on benefits of 4 presentations while 8% selected N/A for 2 of the presentations. The feedback

is evidence that the education sessions continue to meet the needs of the vast majority of the renal community and the objective to cover the renal curriculum for staff.

Increased knowledge, awareness, confidence and improvement of patient management were the main themes around benefits of attending this event and changes to practice.

Overall, the event was a great success. SPRUN continues to review all feedback to explore how it can be utilised to shape and further improve future events.
