Patient First teaching session Evaluation Report



The Scottish Paediatric Renal Urology Network (SPRUN) hosted a Patient First teaching session on Thursday 29th September 2022. Results from the evaluation are as follows.


There were 18 delegates in attendance. Evaluations were received from 5 attendees giving a response rate of 28%.

The aim of this event was to provide up to date education/information for professionals who care for children with renal and/or urology related healthcare needs. Attendees were asked if this objective had been met and to also rate the presentations.

Figure 3 - Objective Met: Providing Up to Date Education/Information





Figure 4 - Presentation Ratings



Additional Benefits

Participants were asked what they had gained as a result of attending this event. The consensus was that the event had provided a lot of useful information which had improved awareness and understanding.

A few quotes are noted below:

 "Absolute better understanding of parents view of a situation when unfortunately their child/children are admitted to hospital and transferred to bigger city hospital and their 'normal' has been taken away from them, home, school & family." "Better awareness of resources for children with chronic renal conditions and especially those needing dialysis and transplant. An insight into the turbulence for the family with a child with these needs."

Practice Influenced or Consolidated




Figure 5 - Practice Influenced or Consolidated

Participants were asked if their practice had been influenced or consolidated by attending the event. 88% of respondents indicated that their practice was either influenced or consolidated as a result of attending this event as indicated in Figure 5 - Practice Influenced or Consolidated.

Participants were asked how their practice would change as a result of attending this event. Points are as noted as below:

- "Allow more time whenever possible to talk at length to parents and express empathy to their situation when their child has been admitted to hospital and offer as much help as possible, physically, mentally and socially and use other specialists to help in the situation if applicable."
- "I will be able to explain the problems associated with dialysis/transplant better with the patient resources."

Summary & Conclusion

There were 18 delegates who attended. Only 5 responses were received to the evaluation giving a response rate of 28%. All respondents indicated that the overall objective of providing up to date education/information had been met. 80% of respondents also found each of the presentations (including case presentations) either highly or mostly beneficial. The feedback is evidence that the education sessions continue to meet the needs of the renal community and the objective to cover the renal curriculum for staff.

Increased knowledge and awareness of patient journey was the main theme around changes to practice.

Overall, the event was a great success. SPRUN continues to review all feedback to explore how it can be utilised to shape and further improve future events.
