Transplant Study Day Evaluation Report

November 2022

The Scottish Paediatric Renal Urology Network (SPRUN) hosted their first hybrid event which was a Transplant Study Day on Tuesday 29th November 2022. Results from the evaluation are as follows.

There were 32 delegates in attendance. Evaluations were received from 12 attendees giving a response rate of 38%.

Figure 1 - Designations

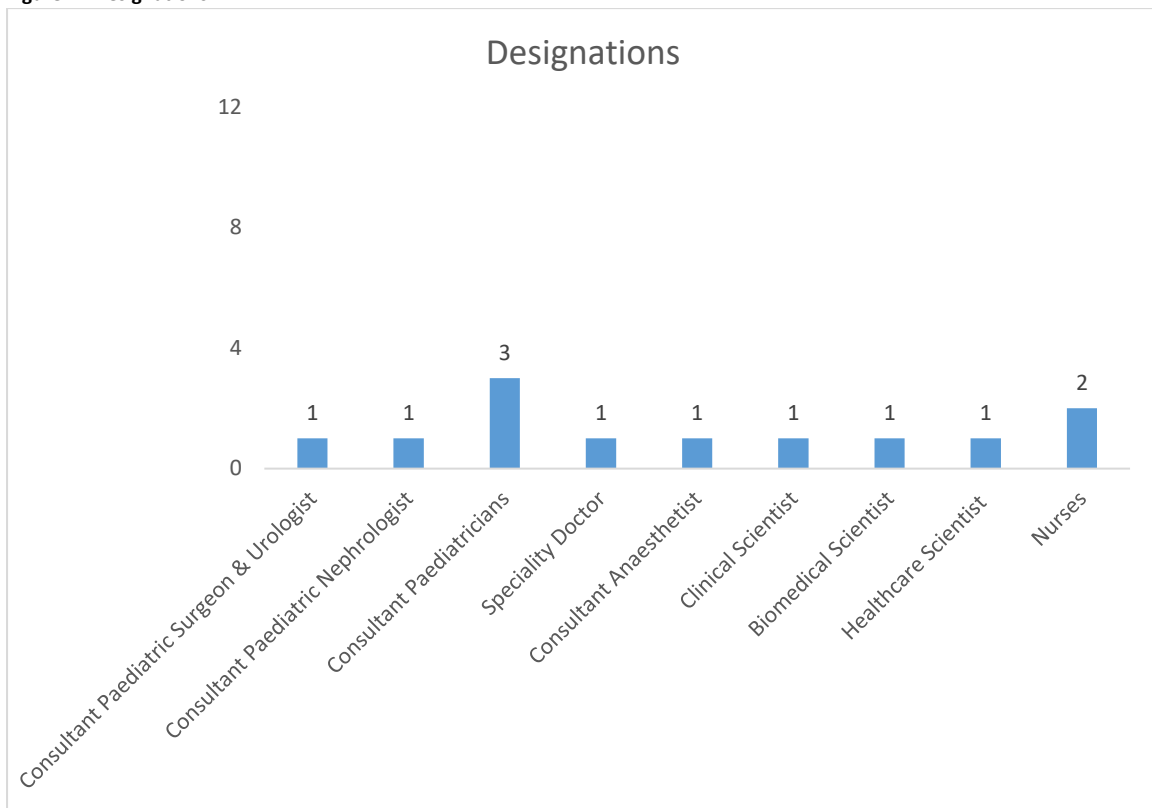
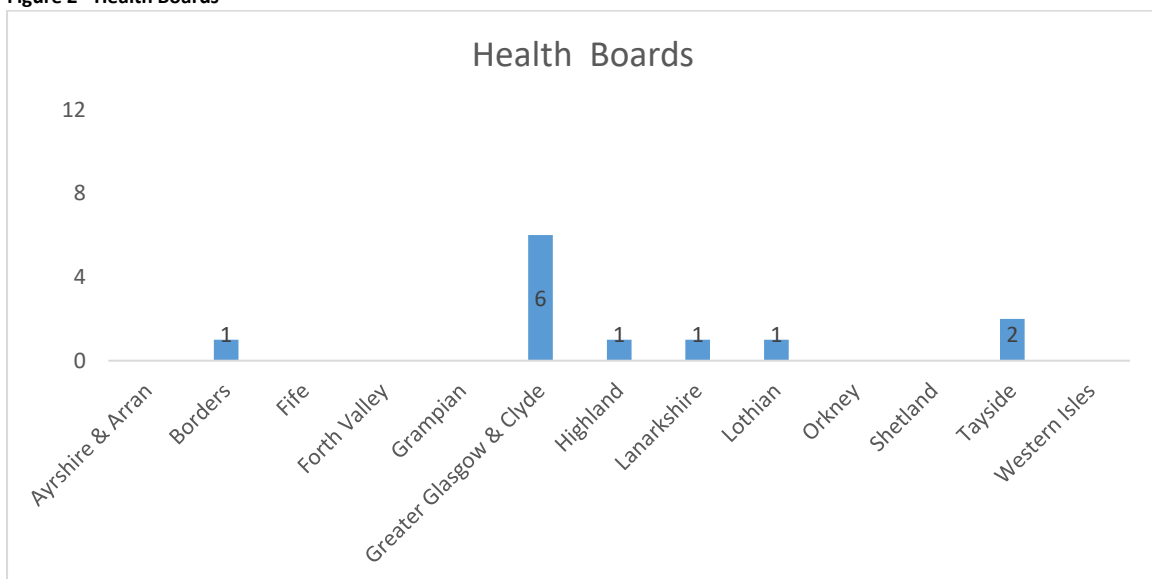


Figure 2 - Health Boards



The aim of this event was to provide up to date education/information for professionals who care for children with renal and/or urology related healthcare needs. Attendees were asked if this objective had been met and to also rate the presentations.

Figure 3 - Objective Met: Providing Up to Date Education/Information

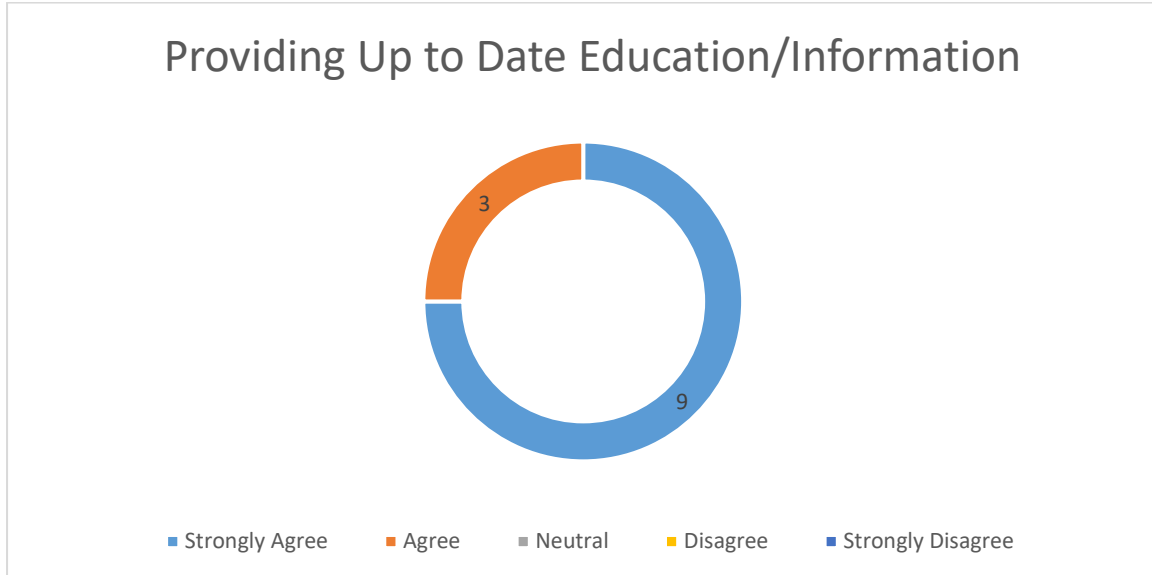
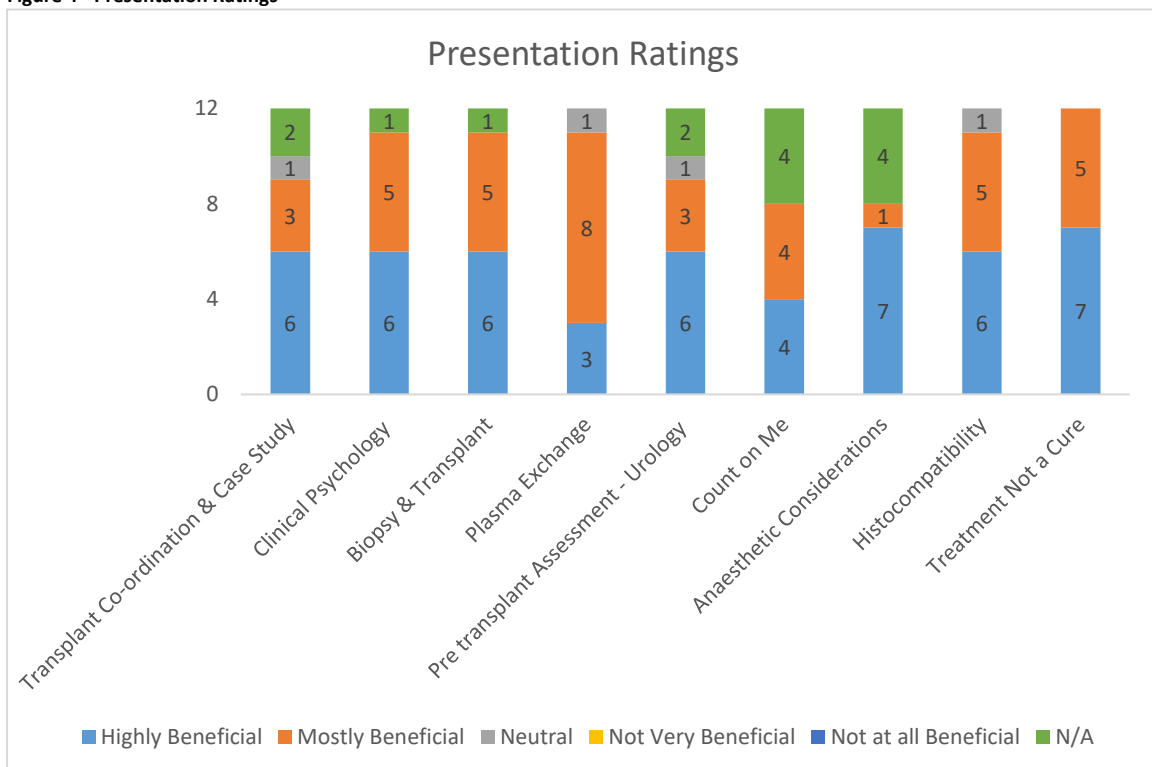


Figure 4 - Presentation Ratings



Additional Benefits

Participants were asked what they had gained as a result of attending this event. The consensus was that the event had provided a lot of useful information which had improved awareness and understanding of pre-transplant process.

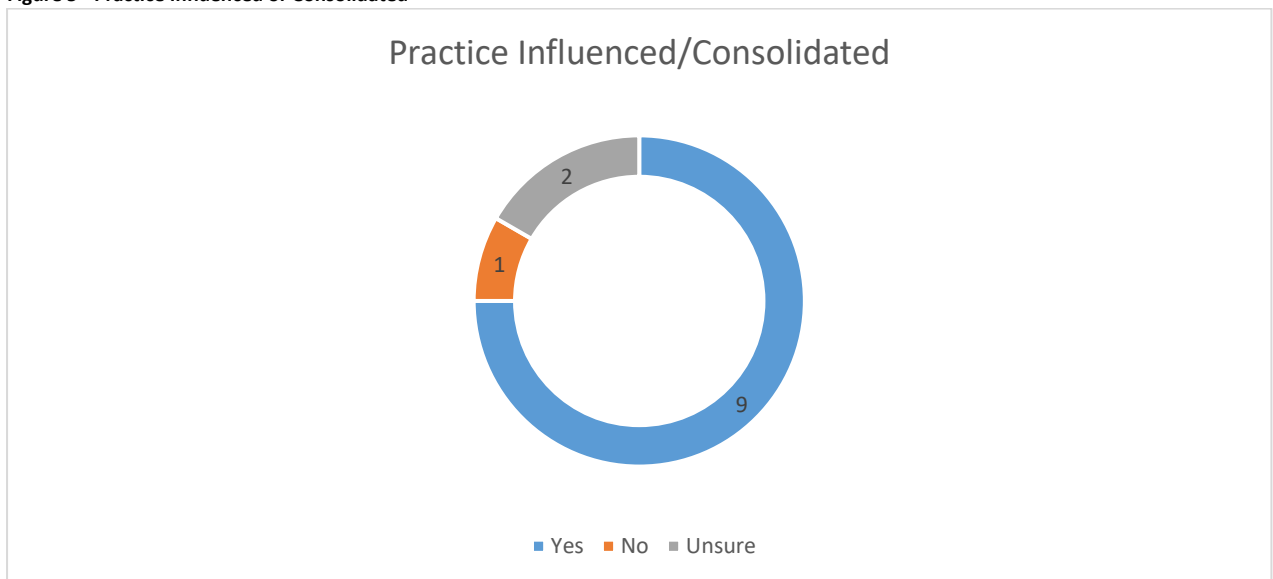
A few quotes are noted below:

- *“Sounder comprehension of the pre-transplant process.”*
- *“Excellent update from tissue lab.”*
- *“For lab staff, a lot of clinical information which will help me assess and interpret test requests.”*
- *“Refresher on the process of pre-transplant preparation and what the families have to go through..”*

Practice Influenced or Consolidated

Participants were asked if their practice had been influenced or consolidated by attending the event. 75% of respondents indicated that their practice was either influenced or consolidated as a result of attending this event as indicated in Figure 5 - Practice Influenced or Consolidated.

Participants were asked how their practice would change as a result of attending this event. Points are as noted as below:

- *“Reflection on practice/Reminder of Patient History/Supports/Blood monitoring, medications & F/U and Other relating factors.”*
- *“Will be better able to decide the urgency of post-transplant DSA samples.”*
- *“Better information for families.”*
- *“.....more aware of the nitty-gritty of the process.”*
- *“.....able to better prepare patients and their families for transplant in the future. It has consolidated my process of review of patients post-transplant.”*

Additional Comments

- *“Thank you.”*

- *“Thumbs up to the hybrid format, this enabled more of our staff to attend.”*
- *“Would have been useful to have more on selection and preparation for families who might be looking at this further down the road. Too many abbreviations in several talks - used a lot of google to help understand.”*
- *“Excellent organisational hard work and knowledgeable speakers! Thanks very much!”*
- *“Excellent presentations and hope to attend in person at next event.”*

Summary & Conclusion

There were 32 delegates who attended. There were 12 evaluation responses giving a response rate of 38%. All respondents indicated that the overall objective of providing up to date education/information had been met. Between 67% - 100% of respondents also found each of the presentations either highly or mostly beneficial. There was an 8% neutral benefit rating for 4 of the presentations and between 8% - 33% selected N/A for 6 of the presentations. The feedback is evidence that the education sessions continue to meet the needs for the vast majority of the renal community and the objective to cover the renal curriculum for staff.

Increased knowledge/awareness of transplant patient journey and management of it were the main themes around changes to practice.

Overall, the event was a great success. SPRUN continues to review all feedback to explore how it can be utilised to shape and further improve future events.
